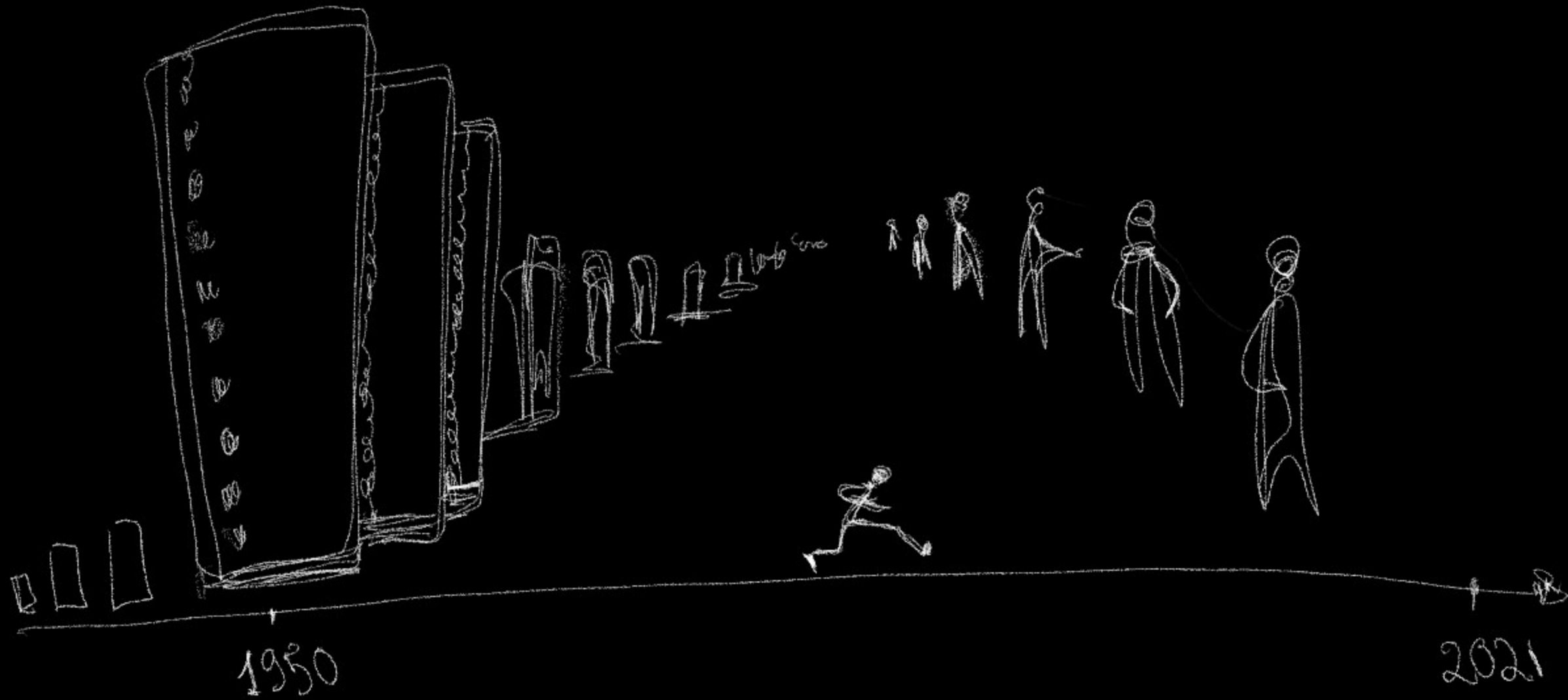

Types of Projects and Standards for Housing Construction, Recommended for the year 1930.

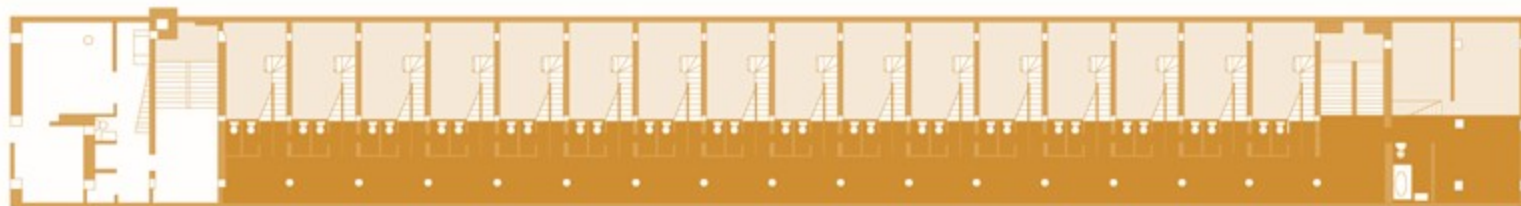
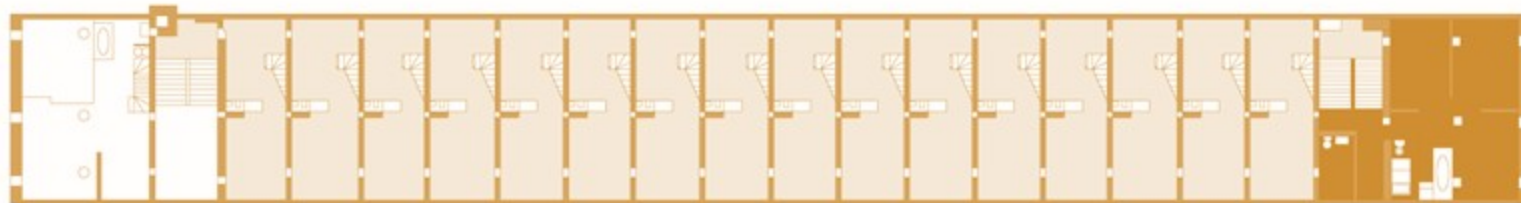

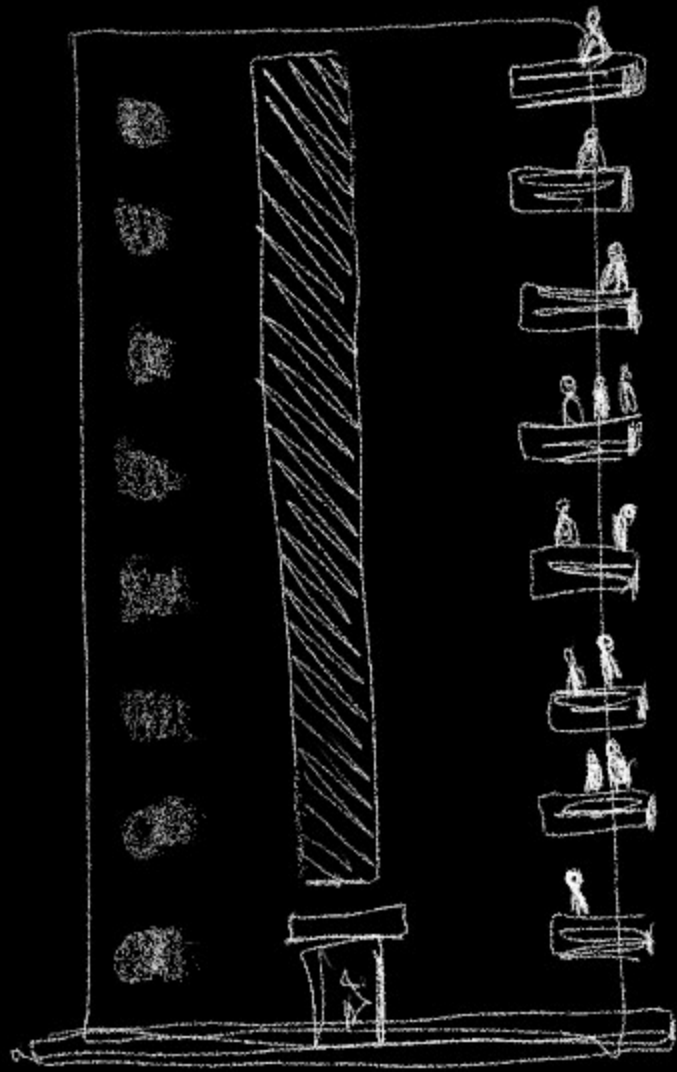








Moscow residential district "Etalon City"
